On Sunday, April 28th, Bethany Lutheran Homes held its 72nd annual meeting. The annual meeting is a celebration of our mission that started when a group of pastors and other caring men and women came together and decided "we need a place to care for the elderly where a Christian philosophy will serve as our guide". Hundreds of people from 34 congregations volunteered their time and contributed funds to start the mission of Bethany Lutheran Homes.



#### Volunteers

Over the past 72 years, Bethany Lutheran Homes has continued to grow and expand its mission and volunteers have continued to be an important part of our success. Bethany Lutheran Homes is a non-profit organization that has an 11-person board of directors, consisting of volunteers, that convene monthly to provide leadership and guidance. We are truly blessed by all the volunteers who have given their time and talent to make Bethany Lutheran Homes the wonderful organization it is today.

#### Expansion

Our Eagle Crest South Phase II expansion is in full swing as it's nearing 50% completion. You can now see the roof line of the 5-story building from a distance and the views are simply breathtaking as you look out over the Mississippi River and to the surrounding bluffs. We are currently taking reservations for the 112 independent living apartments and they are going fast. Our marketing team has been busy giving tours, meeting with individuals to go over floor plans and add custom touches to their new home.

Bethany Lutheran Homes has invested \$6.6 million dollars in equity contribution to the project to lower the cost of rent. With 12 different apartment layouts to choose from, phone, cable TV, internet service and all utilities provided each month, living at Eagle Crest is affordable to most income levels. In the next few months we will begin taking reservations for the new assisted living and memory care apartments as well.

In addition to all the amenities already provided at Eagle Crest South, some of the new amenities that will be added to the expansion include:

- Indoor botanical garden area
- Arts and crafts room
- Large club lounge

- Fishing pier with accessibility for everyone
- Light therapy room
- Indoor car wash bay

# Movin' and Groovin' at Eagle Crest North

Every Monday and Wednesday, our memory care residents are Movin' and Groovin', with the help of some University of Wisconsin-La Crosse graduate students. The students are enrolled in the Doctor of Physical Therapy program at UW-L. As part of their program curriculum the students were to develop and implement a community service-learning project, which highlights health and wellness within a community. The group decided to design and create a new program for the memory care unit at Eagle Crest North.

The 9-week program (total of 20 hours), Movin' and Groovin', has been specifically designed over the course of two semesters with guidance from the instructor of the course, Dr. Heather Fortuine, DPT. The purpose of Movin' and Groovin' is to increase the activity level of residents who reside in the memory care unit and encompasses engaging aerobic, strengthening and balance exercises. Activities have included walking, seated strengthening exercises, seated

dancing to music, group fitness games, and more! The aim of the program is to introduce the many positive benefits that a physically active lifestyle provides for individuals with memory impairments: such as slower decline in cognition, increased cardiovascular fitness and muscular strength, and improved quality of life.

The program has had a positive impact on the participants and on the students. Participants and staff have routinely reported improvements in mood and function as a result of engaging in regular exercise. As students, they have learned a great deal from working with the residents in the memory care unit. Working through this program has allowed them to utilize skills that they have learned throughout their education. They look forward to implementing skills and experiences from this program as future physical therapists.
